For me, Gateway has provided me with real-life experience in an industry relative to my future lines of study and current interests. I was able to gain more knowledge, meet new people in my preferred industry and also accumulate more skills. I was incredibly lucky to have also obtained two jobs at both of my Gateway placements.

Gateway was personally one of the best things that I have completed during my time at Aquinas and I hope to continue this next year. It has made a big difference for me, learning and working around something that I was interested in and wanted to further myself in. I gained not only a variety of different unit standards and credits, but also life-long friends and contacts that have come through my Gateway experience.

I cannot recommend Gateway enough, not only for people that already know their set pathway, but also for those who are unsure of what future career they would like to undertake.

For employers, this real-life experience is incredibly valuable, it can place you above those with no background knowledge and experience. It also gives you a point of difference against other candidates and shows that you have the ability to be successful in your chosen industry.

I am very thankful to Mrs Consedine and the Careers Department for their ongoing support and encouragement to extend myself through Gateway and other lines, it was a decision that I certainly do not regret and would be happy to discuss with anyone that is uncertain as to whether to pursue Gateway!

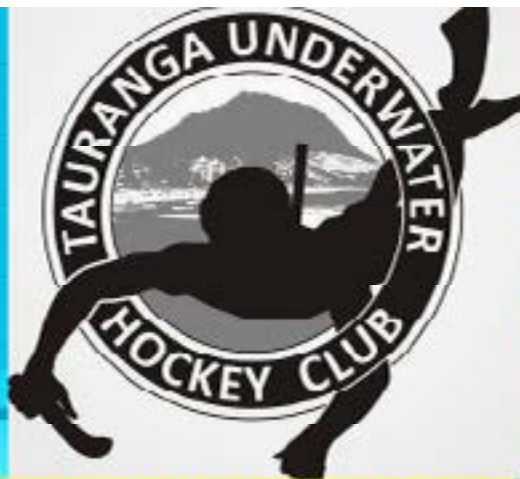
